ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

The Appleby Novice is geared towards providing a friendly learning environment for beginner debaters. Debaters who have broken at university tournaments or have previously qualified for junior nationals are strongly requested **not** to register.

REGISTRATION

For registration purposes, "institution" refers to a group of spots reserved under the same name. An institution could be a school, debate academy, or an independent group of students. Each institution must have an adult supervisor that can be contacted throughout the tournament in case of any issues involving their debaters.

There will be a soft team cap of eight (8) teams per institution. Each institution is required to register one (1) judge every three (3) teams they send to the tournament. Judges may be coaches, university debaters, or senior (grade 11 or 12) debaters. In some cases, exceptions can be made for institutions that wish to designate a grade 10 debater as a judge – these must be approved by the tournament director. If your institution has less than three teams, but has a judge available, please consider registering them. This will help greatly in ensuring that the judging pool at the tournament is of highest quality.

Institutions can reserve spots through two different means.

2. Email debate@appleby.on.ca with the following information: the name of your institution, the full names and grades of each of your debaters organized by team, contact information (phone number and email) of an adult supervisor, and the full names and emails of judges in accordance with the judging requirements above.

JUDGING

Every room at this tournament is expected to receive high-quality judging. However, in order for this tournament to run on time, judges will be limited to a maximum time of 10 minutes to reach a decision and fill in their ballots on Tabbycat. As the purpose of the tournament is development, judges are encouraged to focus their time on feedback, which they will be given an additional 15 minutes for after having completed their ballot. Panels of two judges or more will be made when possible to maximize the number of rooms that benefit from panel judging. If no consensus can be reached after the time allotted of deliberation has passed, the chair is expected to make the final call. The chair also makes the final call on speaker scores, in consultation with panelists and the scoring guide released at the Judges' Briefing. As such, **only the chair** is expected to complete a ballot for their room. This tournament will be tabbed using Tabbycat, and the link will be distributed closer to the date of the tournament. Judges will submit ballots directly to Tabbycat.

EQUITY

The Appleby Novice is committed to promoting a safe, fun, and comfortable environment for all competitors. Equity is an important part of that commitment. Debaters who feel they have been personally attacked by another competitor due to their race, ethnicity, religion, color, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or other factors of their personal identity, are encouraged to seek redress.

If an issue of equity arises, given the developmental nature of this tournament, we will first attempt to facilitate a constructive discussion between the parties involved. However, serious violations will lead to punitive actions proportional to the severity of the issue, up to disqualification from the tournament.
